Science Fiction Films and *Planet of the Apes*

Escape the summer heat with a cool science-fiction movie like *The Planet Of The Apes*. This classic sci-fi film stars Charlton Heston as Colonel Taylor who leads three other astronauts 2,000 years into the future where they find a big surprise - apes have evolved to be the dominant species!! *The Planet Of The Apes* also stars Roddy McDowell and Kim Hunter as the chimpanzee apes Cornelius and Zira. Based on the book by Pierre Boulle, the author of "A Bridge on the River Kwai", this 1968 film won a special Oscar for make-up, which still looks believable over thirty years later. *Planet Of The Apes* stands the test of time with outstanding performances, a smart script, amazing costumes, and great direction. READ THE BOOK AND WATCH THE MOVIE IN JULY!!

Looking for a summer getaway?? Why not try Whistle Stop, Alabama, where *Fried Green Tomatoes At The Whistle Stop Cafe* takes place!! Fannie Flagg's novel revolves between two story lines—one of Idgie and Ruth through the 1920's and 1930's, and one of Evelyn and Ninny in the 1980's. We follow these characters through tragedy, love, murder, and menopause--all of which test the depth of their loyalties and friendships. John Avnet's film version of *Fried Green Tomatoes* vividly brings Whistle Stop to life as well as compliments the story with scenes unique to the film. Starring Oscar winners Jessica Tandy and Kathy Bates, along with Mary Stuart Masterson, Mary-Louise Parker and Cicely Tyson in what the film cover calls "the story of a friendship that defied all obstacles, a devotion that couldn't be broken and a courage unlike any other". ***The Blue And Gray* and War Movies**

Screenwriters Bruce Catton and John Leekly combined true stories of the Civil War with the real life sketchbook and story of Private John Geysler to create the epic mini-series *The Blue and The Gray*. In the film we follow young John Geysler, a sketch artist, through the years prior to and during the Civil War as he leaves his parents' home in rural Virginia and gets a job with his Uncle's newspaper in Gettysburg. We also follow John's friends and family, who are on both sides of the war—Virginia farmers, a Gettysburg newspaper man, a Secret Service agent, cousin against cousin on the front lines, and even President Lincoln himself. The cast is full of well known actor like Gregory Peck, Lloyd Bridges, Coleen Dewhurst, Stacey Keach, and Geraldine Page to name a few. *The Blue And The Gray* is an excellent and honest look at the Civil War. Check out our display of other war movies such as the documentary *The Civil War* by PBS, *Band of Brothers*, *War and Remembrance*, and Ken Burns' *The War*.

set aside. In another bowl, mix the baking mix, milk, 3 tablespoons of sugar, and melted butter into a smooth batter. Pour the batter into the prepared baking dish.

3. Bake in the preheated oven until lightly golden brown on top, 12 to 15 minutes. Allow to cool in the pan.
4. Spread the berry mixture and juice over the cooled shortcake, saving a few pretty berries aside for garnish. With a spatula, gently press down on the berries to allow the juices to soak into the cake. Spread the cream cheese mixture over the fruit, and garnish with the reserved berries. Chill in refrigerator for at least 30 minutes before cutting in squares to serve.

Rhubarb and Strawberry Pie

Ingredients

- 1 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 pound fresh rhubarb, chopped
- 2 pints fresh strawberries
- 1 recipe pastry for a 9 inch double crust pie
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 egg yolk
- 2 tablespoons white sugar

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).
2. In a large bowl, mix flour and sugar. Add strawberries and chopped rhubarb. Toss with sugar and flour and let stand for 30 minutes.
3. Pour filling into pie crust. Dot top with butter, and cover with top crust. Seal edges of top and bottom crust with water.
4. Apply yolk to top of pie, using a pastry brush. Sprinkle with sugar. Cut small holes in top to let steam escape.
5. Bake at 400 degrees F (200 degrees C), for 35 to 40 minutes, or until bubbly and brown. Cool on rack.

INGREDIENTS:

1 quart strawberries, sliced	2 1/3 cups baking mix (such as
1 pint fresh blueberries	Bisquick
1/4 cup white sugar	®)
	1/2 cup milk
1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened	3 tablespoons white sugar
1 (7 ounce) container marshmallow creme	3 tablespoons melted butter

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease an 8x8-inch square baking dish.
